## Action Plan for spending the School Sports Premium

The Government has confirmed £320 million per annum for the academic years 2020-2021, to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is being provided jointly by the Departments of Education, Department of Health and Department of Culture, Media and Sport. We receive this money and it is referred to as Sport Premium. This money is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

## Our total funding is:

- £19,180 (September 2020– July 2021)
- £3075 (underspend from academic year 2019 2020, due to Covid-19)
- £22,255 (total funding)

## **Key indicators**

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular activity Chief medical Officer Guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity in school.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for the whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

## Swimming:

In Year 2018 – 2019, 65% of children, at the end of KS2, were able to swim at least 25 metres, using a range of swimming strokes. This is a 3% increase on the previous academic year.

There is no data held for the 2019 – 2020 and 2020 – 2021 academic year for year 6 children, due to COVID-19.

An increased amount of swimming is planned for the 2021-2022 academic year for upper KS2 to boost progress and to increase the percentage of children, who are able to swim at least 25 metres by the end of KS2.
