

YEAR 6 VISIT TO RAF COSFORD



On Wednesday 29th March, Year 6 visited RAF Cosford as part of their History learning. During our time at the museum, we participated in an interesting and interactive workshop that informed us about the 'Battle of Britain'.

> We learnt about some of roles that both men and women fulfilled during World War II, such as RAF pilots and the Royal

Afterwards, some of us tested out a Morrison Shelter, which would have been used for protection during 'The Blitz'

Observer Corps.



Later in the day, we visited the 4D cinema where we were able to experience what flying is like for an RAF pilot. By exploring the exhibitions, we were able to see British World War II planes such as the Spitfire and Hurricane, in addition to the German Messerschmitt planes.
