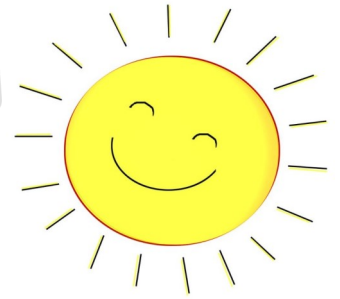


Year 5 Summer Term

Homework

Reading: Pupils need to read the pages set for them by the teacher. They must complete the task set in their yellow book. It is really useful if you comment in their yellow book review so we know how they are getting on with their reading at home.

Maths: Many of the children are now familiar with using 'Times Tables Rock Stars' which they can log into and practise their multiplication and division facts.
